

SNOW REMOVAL PARKING POLICY FOR BON AIRE AND STONEGATE

- No parking is permitted on the street while it is snowing or snow is forecast, day or night.
 - When snow has stopped and the Department of Public Works has plowed curb to curb, residents may exit their lots and park on the street.
 - Please make every effort to put your car back into the condo/co-op lot once it is plowed so the Department of Public Works can continue to clear the roads.
 - Parking is only allowed on the regularly permitted side of the street.
 - Please remove snow from your vehicle in parking lot prior to placement on street.
 - Owners of all apartments, professional and commercial buildings and all condominium associations shall remove all snow and ice from all parking areas and access roads thereto under their control and from all fire lanes within 10 daylight hours after the cessation of a snowstorm. Access to all dwellings and building shall be provided for emergency vehicles within five daylight hours after cessation of a snowstorm.

Overnight Parking

- Parking is prohibited on all public roads in the Village whenever snow is accumulating on the roadway and if snowfall has been forecast. Upon the commencement of snowfall, parking on all such public roads is prohibited until snowfall has ceased and the street is cleared of snow to the curb or edge of pavement.
- A violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of \$100 per offense.

Removal of Snow

- Homeowners must remove all snow and ice within 10 daylight hours after cessation of any snowstorm from sidewalks adjoining their property and from all fire hydrants on their property or adjoining their property. They must continue to keep same clear of snow and ice at all times thereafter as necessary. Said sidewalks must be cleared for the entire length of sidewalk adjoining the property and a minimum of thirty inches in width. Fire hydrants must be cleared by a minimum of 36 inches in all directions and a clear path must be provided to the street for said fire hydrants.
- Single-family dwelling owners over 65 or physically disabled are exempt from removing snow & ice from fire hydrants. Notify the Village Clerk immediately at 357-2600.
- Snowblowing or putting snow in street is prohibited and subject to summons.
